Reflection on Global Tourism

Global tourism was one of the most affected sectors during the COVID-19 crisis. A cumulative drop of \$3 trillion to \$8 trillion before tourism expenditure returns to pre-COVID-19 levels. Recovery will be slow and driven by the underlying dependencies countries had on domestic and non-air travel.

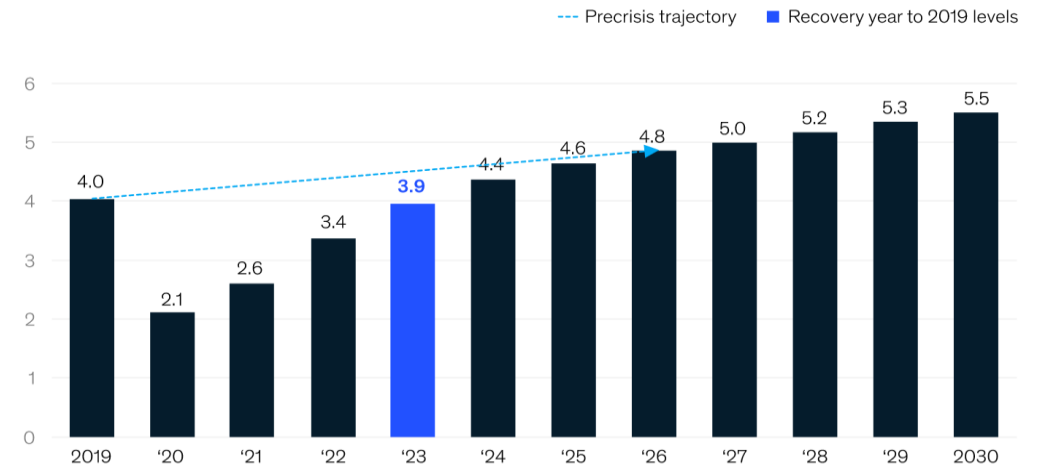

An estimated 1286 million international tourists (overnight visitors) were recorded around the world in 2023, an increase of 34% over 2022. International tourism recovered 88% of pre-pandemic levels, supported by strong pent-up demand (UNWTO Tourism Barometer January 2024-Excerpt).

Challenges To The Recovery of Tourism

While the global travel industry as a whole is recovering, rising travel costs and fees, as well as increased travel risks, remain challenges to the recovery of the global travel industry. The following four factors are also hindering the recovery of the global travel industry



Energy Price

High energy prices remain a major impediment to global travel recovery



Geopolitical

War, great power rivalry and games are also important factors contributing to the disruption of global travel



Wealth Disparity

Further widening of the global wealth gap will profoundly affect the structure and frequency of global travel



Protectionism

Globalization and protectionist competition will further hinder the recovery of the global tourism

Culture and entrepreneurship Collide and Merge

About Tangshan

Since 1949 Tangshan has grown from being largely a coal producer to being a diversified industrial city and the economic leader of Hebei. Tangshan manufactures many of the steel products made in the province; mechanized coal mining has dramatically raised annual output; and the region's thermal-power-generating plant is one of the largest of its kind in China. In addition to producing cement, Tangshan is known for its salt, ceramic, chemical, machinery, and textile industries. In addition to rail lines, the city has been linked by expressways with Beijing, Tianjin, and Shenyang and with Jingang, a new seaport southeast of Tangshan on the Bo Hai that is under the city's administration.

Young Future Leader (YFL), as the U.S. organizer of the U.S. collegiate's Asia Entrepreneurship Tour, plans to recruit 15 outstanding young people in New York to participate in this visit to Tangshan, China. This program will lead American young students to discover this beautiful and mysterious city of Tangshan, and learn about its ceramics culture and industrial evolution, in order to further enhance the U.S. young people's understanding and knowledge of China.

The program will also invite the New York Institute of Finance (NYIF), which has a professional and deep background in the field of youth entrepreneurship, to be the technical support provider for the program to provide curriculum design and teaching support.



Itinerary

- DAY 1** Depart from New York to Beijing, China, check in hotel in Beijing, rest and adjust to jet lag.
- DAY 2** Opening Ceremony, Visit the Forbidden City of China and learn about 5,000 years of Chinese culture
- DAY 3** Visit the Great Wall and learn about China's ancient architectural wonders. Departure from Beijing to Tangshan
- DAY 4** Program ceremony at Library Foreign Experts Bookstore. Overnight stay at the hotel in Tangshan
- DAY 5** Visit Chinese ceramic art and experience the charm of the porcelain capital of China
- DAY 6** Visit the National Mining Park, learn about China's changing energy structure, and NYIF courses
- DAY 7** Visiting Tangshan Caofeidian Port to learn about energy transportation and supply chain management, and NYIF courses
- DAY 8** Visit Tangshan Luanchou Ancient City and experience the traditional culture of the ancient name of northern China.
- DAY 9** Visit the Tangshan Earthquake Ruins Memorial Park to learn about the history of the Tangshan Earthquake
- DAY 10** Closing Ceremony, Departure for Home

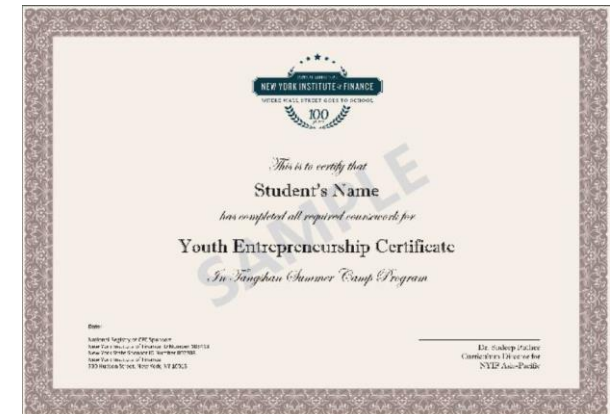

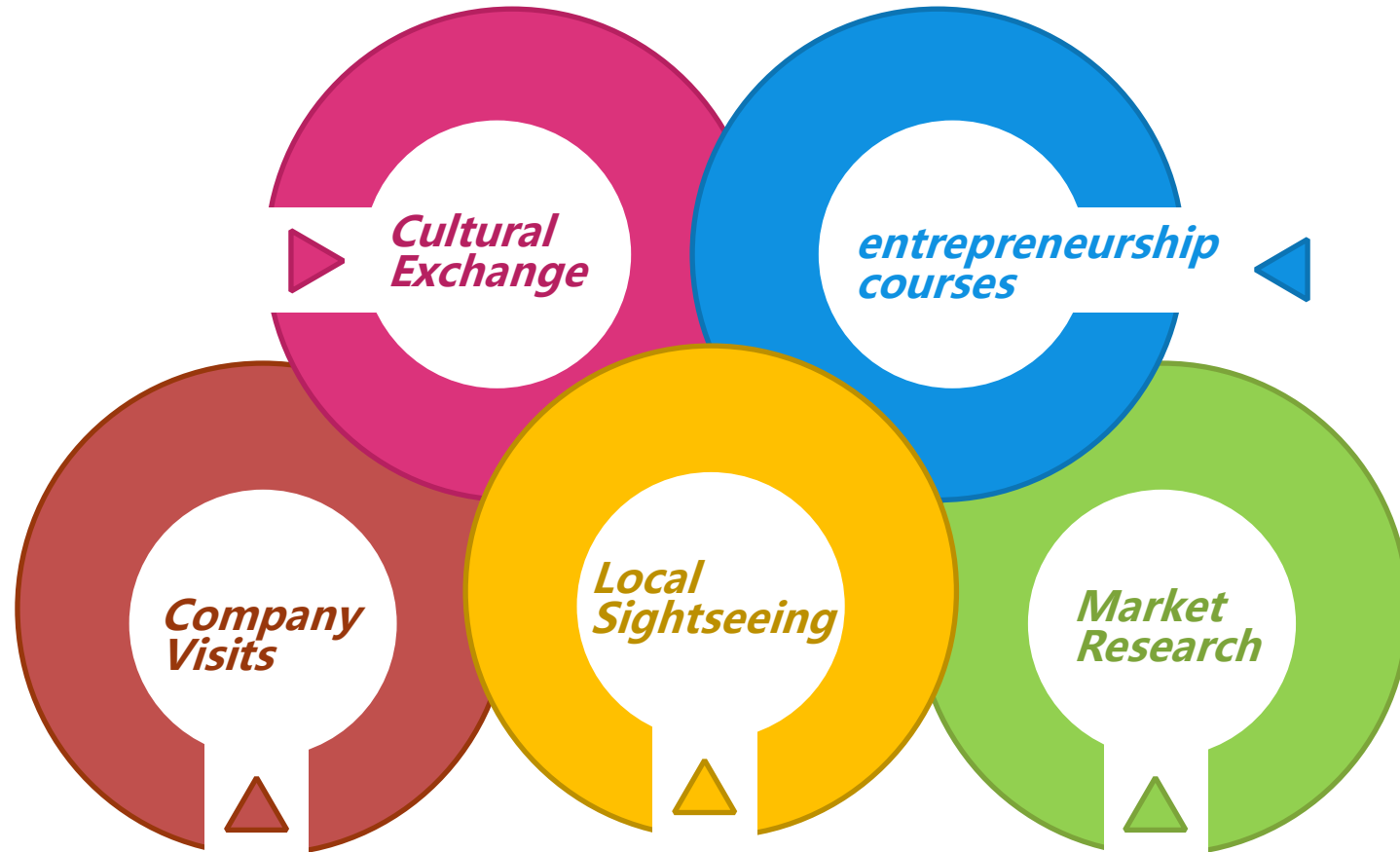
